## **Secretary for Education notice:**

As you know, the Prime Minister has confirmed that all of New Zealand will move to the COVID-19 Protection Framework (CPF) at 11.59pm on Thursday 2 December....

Those of you in Auckland (schools) will retain your current public health measures and other requirements that are in place at Alert Level 3, Step 2 for the remainder of the year.

This means you (Auckland schools) will continue with a mix of students learning from home and have many students learning onsite (whether full-time or part-time). You (Auckland schools) will then move to the CPF from 1 January 2022...
